Opening Moves

Music performance requires a high degree of physical skill, yet until recently,

musical training has paid little attention to the considerable demands made on the mind and body. The *Biology of Musical Performance and Performance-Related Injury* presents singers and instrumentalists with accurate information on the physical processes that underlie their craft. The book provides a concise overview of the biological principles associated with performance technique while assuming no prior scientific knowledge, making it accessible to both musicians and to health professionals who treat performance-related medical conditions. Author Alan H. D. He also provides insight into the origins of performance-related injury, helping to reduce the risk of such problems by encouraging a technique that is sustainable in the long term. Each chapter includes several illustrations and an extensive bibliography for further reading.
